

## **Documentary Evidence**

### **Evidence from Maps:**

Old maps provide very good evidence of the history of roads and other paths. Whilst such maps themselves do not record any user rights, any routes must have been significant enough to be mapped and the maps were intended for use by the public. If old maps clearly show the way marked as a road or old lane it is very good supportive evidence of the way being a road.

#### OS One Inch Ordnance Survey Maps - One-inch England and Wales, 1809 to 1913

Sht 31, 1813 Route is clearly shown as a through road

Sheet 352 - Publication date: 1896 - Route is clearly shown as a significant road and note the current bridleway running south (unfenced track)

#### Ordnance Survey Maps - 25 inch England and Wales, 1841-1952

LXX.1 1880 & 1908 all route is shown in single plot 2969, together with County Road Plantation to the east, no gates.

These half-inch to the mile (1:126,720) maps were produced with recreation use by motorists and tourists in mind, these maps were popular and influential.

Sheet 37 - Publication date: 1903 - Route is shown as an important through road link together with current county road.

#### Geographia 2 inch Road Map

These half-inch to the mile maps were produced for use by motorists. These maps were popular and influential. Quote: 'This beautifully coloured series of Road Maps are indispensable to the Tourist or Business Man, whose destination is off the main road, as in addition to the first and second class roads being prominently indicated, other roads and tracks are very clearly shown'.

### **Primary Evidence:**

#### Inland Revenue Valuation Records - Finance (1908-10) Act 1910

These maps on their own can provide very good evidence of a RoW. If a track is uncoloured on the map and lying between hereditaments, this is very good evidence that it was excluded as being a public road. Footpaths and bridleways are usually included in the hereditament (plot area) but there is a deduction for them in the valuation.

IR 128/5/831 Shows path clearly excluded from adjoining hereditaments. It was most likely excluded because it was considered to be public road. There is no evidence to suggest otherwise.

#### **Tithe Records**

The tithe maps and apportionments are an important source of information about the history and topography of a parish. They provide details of land ownership and occupation, and the type of cultivation of the land. They were produced in order to assess the tithe payable in cash to the parish church for the support of the church and its clergy. Roads were specifically excluded from tithe payments and thus can provide valuable evidence for the existence of Rights of Way. The tithe apportionment often describes public tracks as "Common, wastes and roads" or sometimes "Roads and rivers", which are all areas which generated no tithes for the church. Often such areas excluded from tithe are shaded in a sienna coloured wash. Tithe records can provide reputable evidence on their own taken in support of other standards of public records.

Camborne map 11, Western end is parcel 3608 route then crosses parcel 3551,to reach road parcel 1359. Apportionments show 3608 as 'Road and Waste, 3551 as 'Downs, rough pasture, owner' and 1359 as Road, Waste and Leat. No tithe on 1359, No tithe breakdown given for 3608 and 1359.

Camborne, Plot 2969, Described as 'Road' (in single plot with County Road)

#### Other Evidence:

#### **Definitive Map Records**

Cornwall Council GIS map shows unrecorded section of path clearly depicted as a wide track.

#### **Land Ownership**

Exclusion of a path from land registrations on either side is very indicative of public rights. However where an adjacent registration includes a path this does not give any indication against public rights. Land registrations sometimes deliberately or inadvertently extend ownership beyond that shown on the original deeds.

First part of route is not registered

### **Summary and Statement of Reasons:**

The Inland Revenue map shows all of the road excluded from the adjacent hereditaments. It was most likely excluded because it was considered to be public road. Adjacent public roads are similarly depicted. There is no evidence to suggest otherwise. The OS 25 inch map showing the path as a Road in a separate plot indicates the significance of the route. All the old maps, which were intended for public navigation, show the route consistently as a road. This is very strong supportive evidence of the status of the route as a public road.

The tithe map is inconclusive as the unrecorded section is 'Downs'. Path on such 'common' area were not often recorded on tithe.

We note that there is Chapel on the connecting road to the East. We submit that the public will have regularly used the route to go to the chapel from Carwynnen.

The evidence strongly suggests use as public road. The combination of the evidence from Old Maps, Inland Revenue map 1910 and Area Book gives strong indication that the path is highway and now should be recorded with Restricted Byway Status.


In order to be able to modify the definitive map and statement, the Surveying Authority needs to have a discovery of evidence which shows, on the balance of probabilities, that highway rights exist. While no single piece of evidence is necessarily conclusive, the applicant believes that taken as a whole the evidence demonstrates highway reputation.





Eastern Section - note single plot number (2969) together with western section. Also note Wesleyan Chapel further up Road







Route is clearly shown as a through road






Inland Revenue Valuation Records - Finance (1908-10) Act 1910

IR128/5/831 Shows all of route excluded similar fashion to connecting County Roads




