It also shows an enclosure that the current owner of the field recalls in the 70's. This rectangle is where we believe the CC team think the barn is now! 200 year old buildings do not 'move' a pink line on a map can be 'moved'. Common sense required here.
- 14. Current CC Map online showing the path going through 2 walls of the barn. have indicated where the path has shown over the last century on all mapping. It has never been within the curtilage of property. Disappointed that identifying the problems with the mapping of the start of this path has been so stressful and difficult when the Council is **obliged** to correct footpaths when sufficient and new evidence is provided which we have done this year. Extinguishing it is the correct thing to happen as it actually goes nowhere! And is unfit for the public to use.
