
## -CONSERVATION WALKS-

At stretch of bridal/cycle way that lies within an Area of Outstanding Natural Auty which links two steep bendy roads that lead into the village of Ruan Anihorne. This short section of bridleway also connects with the current network of public footpaths around the village. The bridleway follows the old farm track which has now developed into a length of tall tussocky grass which is a wonderful habitat for insects birds and bats.
